For Zone T-69 It is important to note that the City has not levied an assessment upon property owners in the three operational years (FY 17-18, 18-19, & 19-20) since this zone was transferred to the City. As you & the Board are aware, the City funded annual operational costs by utilizing/spending down the fund balance originally transferred by LA County.

Based on our forecast, I have every expectation that the City will begin levying landscape assessments beginning in Fiscal Year 2020-2021. While the maximum assessment rate per single family residential property is currently \$677.87, I do not anticipate recommending to levy the maximum. We are still about four months away from beginning to look at projected assessment rates for next fiscal year, and would be happy to meet with the Board in early 2020 to discuss options for how to "turn back on" the assessment.
